## About OYO: History

- OYO is an all-volunteer organization
- OYO was founded in 1975
- Baseball was played on a single field behind Oaklandon Elementary
- We have grown to service nearly 1000 kids, 90 teams
- We now manage a facility of 12 fields at Veterans Memorial Park
- Our 2011 board includes 40 volunteers covering 45 board positions

- No alcoholic beverages
- No roller blades, bikes, or skateboards
- No swinging of bats outside the fields or batting cage areas
- No throwing of balls outside the fields or warm-up areas

# Coaching Philosophy

## OYO Spring Ball = Instructional League

- We do not keep records
- We do not use records to seed for the tournament
- Fair Play League

### Being a Player's Coach

*Coaches are expected to:*

- take advantage of life lesson opportunities
- teach good fundamentals, skills
- teach all kids, not just the more talented players
- rotate kids regularly

**Player-Coach relationships last a lifetime**



# The OYO Way: Support Our Umpires

- Youth and Adult Umpire Program
- Kids start umpiring at age 11
- Umpire is in charge, regardless of his/her age
- Give the umpires the same kind of respect you want them to give you
- Coaches and fans do not change the calls an umpire has made
- Be a positive example to the young ballplayers and young individuals around you



# Code of Conduct: Accountability for All

- All of you agreed to the OYO Code of Conduct when you registered
- All players will sign a team-specific Code of Conduct form before games begin
- Review the Code of Conduct with your child at the beginning of the season and before the tournament

The Oaklandon Youth Organization Systemwide "Code of Conduct" to be reviewed, and signed by all players, parents, and participants.

Base Ball League, Cal Ripken Division, and Amateur Softball Association

**DEVELOP A STRONG, CLEAN, HEALTHY BODY, MIND AND SOUL.**  
Any form of alcohol, tobacco or drugs are strictly prohibited from any and all OYO premises that offenses will result in a two-game suspension and second offense will result in indefinite suspension for individual involved with possible OYO Executive Board of Directors reinstatement the following year.

**DEVELOP A STRONG URGE FOR SPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT.**  
OYO will hold all participants, players, coaches and spectators, accountable for any actions that may be deemed detrimental to either the safety of play or the safety of anyone present.

**DEVELOP UNDERSTANDING OF AND RESPECT FOR THE RULES.**  
Knowing the rules makes for better players, coaches and spectators.

**DEVELOP COURAGE IN DEFEAT, TOLERANCE AND MODESTY IN VICTORY.**  
Good sports make us better all. Please continue to teach our kids life lessons.

**DEVELOP CONTROL OVER EMOTIONS AND SPEECH.**  
Respect our umpires, coaches, players and spectators. Do not make a positive comment. It is probably not a good one. Profanity, degrading remarks, acts of violence or any form of intimidation will not be tolerated. Anyone using profanity will be asked to leave the park immediately. If this person does not leave the park and delay the game, that player will be suspended for 10 days. If a second offense occurs, player will be suspended indefinitely and reinstatement by OYO Executive Board of Directors approval will be required. It is up to the Coach to communicate the respectful attitude to their players and families.

**DEVELOP SPIRIT OF COOPERATION AND TEAM PLAY.**  
Play without bias/effort, striving to make one another better.

**DEVELOP INTO REAL, TRUE CITIZENS**  
All players, coaches and spectators are part of our OYO community and are accountable for their actions.

OYO expressly reserves the right to revoke any and all privileges in respect to playing, coaching or watching any games at Veterans Memorial Park. If an act is considered a violation of our "Code of Conduct", immediate suspension until the OYO Executive Board can evaluate each act. Any type of ejection from a game, whether player, coach or spectator, will result in a second game suspension. The person ejected would need to be reinstated by the OYO Executive Board prior to any additional participation. Any action by the OYO Executive Board will carry a minimum of a one-game suspension and maximum of ejection from the league.

The team's Code of Conduct will be signed by each individual player and be on file with the League Commission prior to participation.

# Game Rules – All Leagues

- **Non-Standing League** – wins and losses have no bearings on tournament pairings
- **Fair Play Rule** – all players must play one inning in the infield and one inning in the outfield every game – this rule is waived during the tournament
- **Position Maximum** – no player may play a position more than three innings in a game – this rule is waived during the tournament
- **Mercy Rule** – There is no run-lead mercy rule for the regular season. Continue playing until game is complete or time limit kicks in.
- **Protests (Tournament Only)** – Must be filed immediately with nearest league official before play resumes. Must be accompanied with \$100 deposit. Protest will be determined before play resumes. If protest is upheld, deposit is returned. If protest is denied, deposit is awarded to a local charity.

# Special Requests

- More than half of all players make a special request
  - Practice Nights, Game Nights
  - Play for Specific Coach, with a Specific Friend
  - Team Name
- We grant what is possible and feasible
  - Only request that cannot be considered is game nights
- Primary responsibility
  - Ensuring balanced teams and creating a memorable and competitive experience for all teams
  - Team assignments were released last weekend; all families in 12 and under leagues should have heard from their coach by now

# Selection Process Used

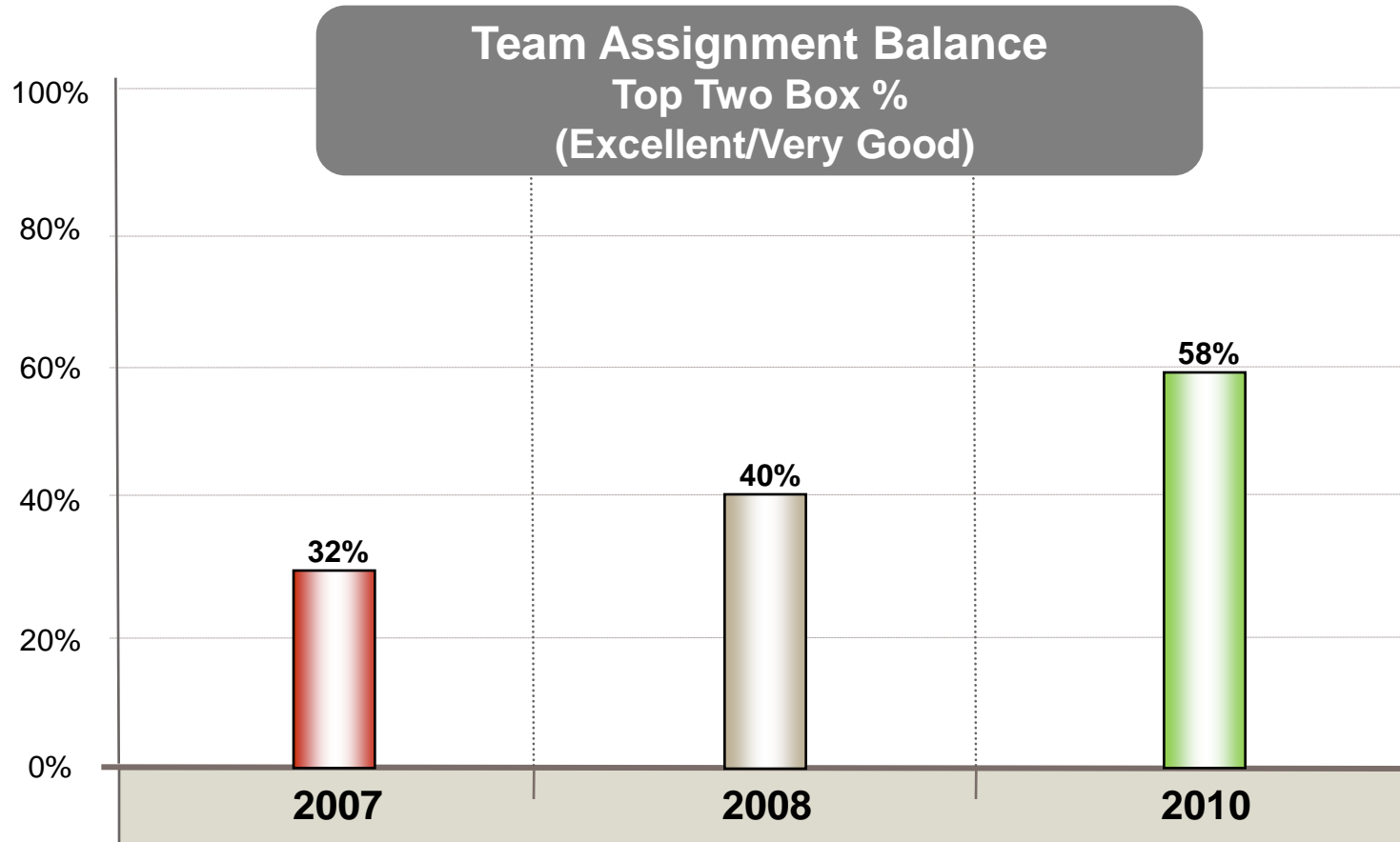
### BASEBALL – RANK ‘N SET

- Coaches review all players for proper placement
- Commissioner develops teams selecting one player from each round, based on coach approval
- Play-together requests are granted where possible so long as team balance is not compromised
- All team rosters reviewed and approved by Executive Vice President
- Coaches notify players beginning March 5, no later than March 8

### SOFTBALL – PLAYER DRAFT

- Coaches review all players for proper placement, make changes as needed
- Coaches draft teams
- Play-together requests to be considered when drafting players
- Pitchers and catchers are drafted first
- Team rosters are **not** considered final until final review of sponsor assignments
- Coaches notify players beginning March 5, no later than March 8

# Batting Cages & Practices

- **Reserving Batting Cages**
  - OYO offers three batting cages at its facility (Cages A, B, and C)
  - Teams may reserve cages for one hour (on the hour) weekly
- **Practices**
  - All official team practices must be held at OYO
    - Indoor practices may be scheduled at Sandlot, Sports of All Sorts
  - Each team will be granted one weeknight practice through April 29 and one Saturday practice until games begin (on April 16)
  - Coaches should not base any playing time decisions on a player's practice attendance

# 2011 Game Schedule Structure

- **Games scheduled on every night**
  - No open date reserved for rainouts
  - Minimal number, if any, games scheduled for Fridays
- **Doubleheaders begin April 23**
- **In May, teams will have one of the following combos every week**
  - One Saturday game, two weeknight games
  - Two Saturday games, one weeknight games
  - With odd number of teams in their leagues, Rookie Baseball, 10U Softball and 12U Softball will follow a slightly different schedule formula
- **All-Star Games scheduled for Thursday, May 26**
  - No Rain Date
  - All leagues will have one game
- **No games scheduled for Memorial Day weekend (Fri thru Mon)**



# In-house Rec Tournament

- **Double-elimination tournament**
  - Challengers and Tee Ball do not have tournament
  - Challengers and Tee Ball scheduled for two games between June 6-11
- **Begins Monday, June 6**
  - Tournament Drawing is on Saturday, May 14
  - Tournament Schedule (dates/times) posted on Monday, May 23
- **Focused on having a single Championship Day for all leagues no later than Wednesday, June 15**
  - If needed games, would be played following night
- **Schedule still indicates tournament runs thru June 18 in the event rainouts force delays**

# Rainout Policy

- **Rainout games are not rescheduled**
  - *OYO's Goal:* Provide teams 13 games for older leagues, 12 for younger leagues (same number we've provided for more than a decade)
  - We schedule two additional games for each team
  - Goal not always possible due to weather
  - Teams with disproportionate number of cancellations will be scheduled for an extra game on Sunday, June 5
  - More responsibility placed on coaches and parents to make fields playable in 2011, but final decision on field use rests with AODs
- **If first two Saturdays of games are rained out... (4/16 & 4/23)**
  - Practices for week of April 25-29 will be canceled to allow for all April 23 games to be played during that week

- **Practices**

- Weatherline is NOT used for practices
- Families will be notified by their coach if practice is canceled

- **Games**

- OYO's Advisors on Duty (AODs) will determine if games are being played
- Updates will be communicated via Weatherline no later than 45 minutes before game time, possibly earlier

- **Weatherline Protocol**

- Listen to entire message – some games may get canceled while others will not
- On Saturdays, check back regularly as updates are left all day long when weather is in doubt

- Attend mandatory pre-tournament meeting on June 2

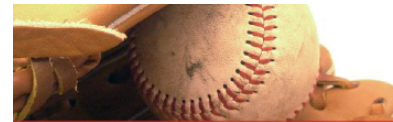

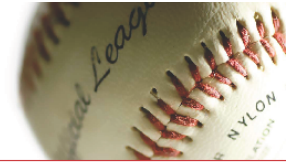
